CIL GRANT POLICY

Guidance Notes

1. What is the purpose of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding?

CIL is a charge on development that came into force in 2010 (and runs in tandem with s.106 contributions). The purpose of the CIL is to fund infrastructure to support local development.

- a) CIL funding can be used to fund the development of the local area, to fund the provision, improvement or replacement of infrastructure. Infrastructure includes physical, social and green infrastructure. For example: highways; education facilities; sports and community halls; parks and play areas.
- b) CIL funding may also be used to fund anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that new housing development places on an area. For example, community transport schemes.
- c) CIL monies cannot be used on items or services which fall outside the Parish Council's remit by statute.

2. Who can apply for CIL funding from the Parish Council?

- a) The applying organisation must be a properly constituted body which works wholly in the parish of Ringmer or is shown to operate for the benefit of parishioners.
- b) The applying organisation must have their own bank account requiring at least two signatories to authorise cheques/ payments.
- c) No organisation is specifically excluded from applying for CIL grant funding, but the Council must have regard to the legal framework within which it operates when considering every application. Applications from churches and schools will not usually be eligible but may be considered depending on the nature of the project, and subject to the Council's legal constraints on funding these organisations.
- d) CIL grant funding may not be directly awarded to an individual, or a private organisation operated as a business to make a profit or surplus. (An organisation may contract with a third-party private contractor to provide goods or services as part of the project).

3. How much can be applied for?

- a) The minimum amount of CIL grant funding which can be applied for from £500.
- b) If the total project value is greater than the CIL funding applied for, match funding must be in place or demonstrably available before a grant can be awarded.
- c) The applying organisation must be able to show that the total spending on the project is commensurate with the benefit to be derived from it.
- d) The impact on/ benefit to the community of Ringmer must be clearly demonstrated in the application.

e) Only one award of grant funding will be made per organisation in any financial year.

4. What can be funded?

- a) Physical, social or green infrastructure projects as set out in 1 (a) & (b). For example, enhancing or replacing an existing asset, or investing in a new asset, to benefit the community of Ringmer.
- b) Grant funding may not be awarded to a project or specific project phase, that has been started prior to approval. Retrospective funding applications will not be accepted.
- c) The applying organisation must show that the project is sustainable, and that procedures and/or funding are in place to ensure that it is continued, maintained or developed beyond the short-term.
- d) If the applying organisation will enter into a contract for the supply of goods or materials, or for the execution of works or specialist services in order to deliver the project, value for money must be demonstrated in line with the Council's financial regulations.
 - i. Where the value of the contract is £3,000 or lower, the applying organisation must **strive** to obtain three estimates (prices) for the goods/ materials/ services. Evidence that an attempt to obtain three estimates must be provided to the Council before funding can be released. The organisation is not obliged to accept the lowest estimate, but if it is not accepted a justification needs to be provided along with the evidence.
 - ii. Where the value of the contract is over £3,000, the applying organisation **must** obtain three written quotations and provide evidence to the Council as set out above.
 - iii. PLEASE NOTE that an organisation may make an application having obtained one estimate/ written quotation. Funding may be awarded to the project subject to the organisation obtaining further estimates/ written quotations at a later date. Funding may only be released once evidence of the estimates/quotations has been provided to the Council.
- e) The project must be completed, within 18 months from awarding of the grant.

5. What is the process of applying for funding?

- a) In the first instance the applying organisation should complete an expression of interest form. The Council will screen all expressions of interest to check that the organisation and project are eligible to receive CIL funding.
- b) Eligible organisations/projects will be invited to complete a full application form which will be assessed by the Office and Finance Committee before going to Full Council with their recommendation.

6. Other requirements

- a) Details additional to those in the application may be requested as necessary.
- b) The applying organisation will be required to provide financial statements (except for new organisations).
- c) The Council may verify that the grant has been used for the purpose it was given and, if it was not, the grant will be reclaimed, and no further grants will be awarded in future.
- d) The Council may require pictorial and/ or written feedback on the success of the project for which the grant was awarded.
