



IMPORTANT ROADWORKS INFORMATION

8 April 2025

B2192, Halland to Ringmer

Dear Resident / Business owner,

Balfour Beatty is working in partnership with East Sussex County Council to manage the highways service across East Sussex. As part of this, we will be installing new signage, posts and verge markers on the B2192 between Halland and Ringmer.

When do they start?

The work be will carried out in the below phases:

Phase 1: **Thursday 24 April 2025** – From The Bluebell Inn to Shortgate Lane.

Phase 2: **Friday 25 April 2025** – From Shortgate Lane to Knowle Lane.

Phase 3: **Monday 28 April to Wednesday 30 April 2025** - From Knowle Road to the A22.

Phase 4: **Thursday 1 May 2025** - From 'Lower Lodge Bungalow' to The Broyle.

Phase 5: **Thursday 8 May** - Junction with New Road.

Phase 5a: **Thursday 8 May to Monday 12 May 2025** – From New Road to The Broyle.

Phase 6: **Tuesday 13 May to Tuesday 20 May 2025** – From Lewes Road to The Bluebell Inn.

Phase 7: **Wednesday 21 May to Saturday 24 May 2025** – Ringmer Road from A26 to New Road.

We will inform you of any changes to the dates or times via advanced warning signs on site.

How will this impact highway users?

The road will remain open during phases 1-6 with temporary traffic lights in place between 9:30am and 4pm.

The road will remain open during phase 7 with temporary traffic lights in place between 8pm and 6am.

Information for residents and businesses

Parking: We will put out 'no parking' signs and cones on the site to advise where parking is restricted. Please avoid parking in these locations as it will delay our works.

Weather: All of these works are subject to favourable weather conditions, for example heavy rain may affect the progress of the works.



Properties close to the carriageway may experience a temporary disturbance as this can be a noisy process and those properties may experience flashing lights and reversing sirens.

We would like to take this opportunity to apologise in advance for any inconvenience or disruption this work may cause, however this forms part of our continuing improvement for the East Sussex highway network.
